Worthy Principal Secretary, TE & IT, Punjab desired that the college should start the process of getting the status of Deemed University. It was desired that internal revenue generation be started by way of consultancy and use of infrastructure facilities. It was also decided to implement the 65 point programme under MIS which has been approved for Shaheed Bhagat Singh College of Engineering & Technology, Ferozepur. The Board was also informed about the association formed by the faculty in the college and Principal was told by the Board that no misconduct by any faculty and staff be tolerated and actions as per rules be initiated if any, faculty or staff try to create any nuisance in the college.

Shri Raman Behl discussed the matter of regularizing the services of the persons working on wage/contract/consolidated salary on the basis of the notification issued by the previous government. After detailed deliberation, it was decided that they have to work on contract basis for which the letters have already been issued. This is in line with the case of Teachers who are also appointed on contract basis as per the policy decision taken earlier.

- 7.16.1 To regularize the adhoc services of Shri Rajeev Kumar Bedi, Lecturer in Computer Science & Engineering.

The item was not approved. The Principal was asked to send the post occupied by him for advertisement to Director, Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab, Chandigarh and he should continue till the new incumbent joins after the selection.

The decision taken has been implemented.

7.16.2 Besides the agenda items, the following discussions were made and decisions were taken which are to be applicable to all the engineering colleges being managed by the Government.

1) It was decided to review the College Bye-Laws applicable to Government managed Colleges after every 10 years. A committee will be constituted by the worthy PSTE/IT for this purpose. It was also emphasized that regular meetings of Board of Governors of Government managed Colleges shall be held at least once in three months.

2) It was decided that during every Board meeting of Government managed colleges, at least one of the College Department of would make detailed presentation of their vision, mission, action plan with Milestones and timelines along with the future roadmap before the Board. Principal of the The Colleges would constantly review these roadmaps for their timely ensuring implementation.

- 3) It was decided that all Government managed Colleges would establish a close liaison with Government of India Ministries and Agencies from where funds are available and could be arranged. For this purpose, every college would prepare projects in each Department and submit the same to the Government of India Ministries and Agencies concerned for funding. Every year at least Rs. 1.00 crores should be sanctioned from Government of India under various projects. For this purpose one person could be centrally engaged by all the Colleges in Delhi who could work in collaboration with the liaison Officer of Punjab Infotech.
- Projects have been submitted to the various agencies under Govt. of India. As regards to engagement of one person for liaison purpose at Delhi, the common decision needs to be taken.

Government managed Colleges must make all efforts to create close liaison and collaboration with the Industry. They may work with Industry and offer various continuing education programme/ short duration courses to ensure internal generation. It was explained that Government of Punjab has already approved the sharing of IRG and charges consultancy amongst all Stakeholders with the approval Finance Department.

Decision taken has been implemented.

5) It was discussed and decided that when buying a costly equipment for the Lab costing beyond Rs. 5.00 lacs, the proposal submitted by HOD concerned should also be accompanied by its utilization plan. This utilization should no be less than 30 hours per week including any outsourcing to the Industry for use. It was also decided that every equipment should have a log book which should record the usage, the down time and the repair and maintenance schedule etc. of equipment.

Decision taken has been implemented.

- 6) It was decided that all Principals must carry out energy audits within their Institutions and take steps to reduce the connected load thereby reducing the power bill considerably. For this purpose the change over switches could also be deployed wherever possible.
- 7) It was explained by Secretary Information Technology that while fixing the fee for Engineering Colleges, a special of component Infrastructure was also included in the fee subject to condition that minimum specified IT facility including PCs and connectivity would be made available to the student. However, even the minimum service is not being provided. It was decided that all Principals would carry out internal audits and ensure that adequate number of PCs along with internet connectivity including WiFi facility would be provided in every Institutions. Internet connectivity may also be provided in the Hostels where students would be encouraged to use their Laptops.

- 8) It explained by was Information Secretary, Technology that about 15 lacs power point slides were prepared by Diploma and Certificate Level Institutions to be used as teaching aid. Similar exercise initiated in Colleges. However, now the exercise needs to be completed that the existing slides could be made available for up gradation to degree level. All faculty members under the Scheme would prepare 1000 slides on the subject being taught by them which could be shared amongst all of them.

9) The requirement imparting soft skills to the students was emphasized and it was decided that a course like P-Toss (Punjab Training on Soft Skills) may be administered to them for improving their soft skills. For this purpose, assistance of Punjab Information and Communication Technology Corporation should be taken if required. It was also decided that every student in each subject should be encouraged to make a power point presentation every fortnight to help him/her in improving communication skills for better job placement and successful career thereafter.

Efforts are being made to get the decision implemented.

10) It was emphasized by the PSTE&IT that a proper Management Information System (MIS) is required to closely monitor the progress and performance of the Engineering Colleges and Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar. He further explained that for this purpose the Finance Committee and BOG of PTU has already approved development of software by Punjab Information Communication Technology Corporation. He desired Secretary I.T. to go ahead get the MIS implemented in PTU as well as the Institutions at the earliest.

12) It was emphasized by PSTE&IT that all the Engineering Colleges should lay special emphasis on internal resource generation by ensuring adequate utilization of faculty and machinery for undertaking commercial activities which could provide income to faculty, students and the institute. The sharing pattern for the revenue generated shall be decided in a common meeting to be taken by PSTE&IT with all the Principals of Engineering Colleges in which Mr. N.S. Kalsi, IAS Directorcum-secretary Information and Technology would be a special invitee. Director Technical Education and Industrial Training would also participate. The idea being generation maximum resources for the colleges in addition to normal tuition fee with a view of upgrading the infrastructure of colleges to international standards."

- ii) M. Tech. Courses: Besides 6 under graduate courses, the college is running two post graduate courses in the disciplines of (1) Mechanical Engineering (Production Engineering) (2) Electronics & Communication Engineering under the Regional Centre of Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar. The college has also started from 2007 a post graduate course in Mechanical Engineering (Thermal Engineering) with an annual intake of 18 students at its own sanctioned by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi.
- iii) ACCREDITATION: It is also being brought on the record that the college has applied for Accreditation from National Board of Accreditation, New Delhi in the disciplines of Computer Science & Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Electronics & Communication Engineering. The proposal of this committee was further discussed in a meeting held under the chairmanship of Shri Gurdev Singh Sidhu, IAS, the then DTE & IT, Punjab with Shri Mohanbir Singh, ADTE, Punjab and all the Principals of 5 Govt. promoted Engg. Colleges and the same was recommended for approval from the Chairman, Board of Governors which was approved by Hon'ble TEMcum-Chairperson, Board of Governors. However, vide memo # 71-75/S-3/ECC/2006 dated 11.1.2007, it was informed by DTE & IT, Punjab that the proceedings of the committee have been approved by Hon'ble TEMcum-Chairperson, Board of Governors, however the same be got ratified by the respective colleges in their meetings of Board of Governors. Besides, the following items are also approved and asked to put up in the meeting of Board of Governors for formal approval:

- A separate wing for exhibitions of various products could also be established in each college, the standard design of each college shall also be got approved for each college from the Board of Governors.
- 2. Each engineering college shall also have a polytechnic, ITI and upto 10+2 school to make it a composite unit and also for

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providing facilities.

3. Each college shall also have a well equipped dispensary/aurvedic doctor/yoga instructor, a nursery of plants and an ambulance.

Item #8.12 To approve the construction of Multipurpose Auditorium and Conference Hall.

As the college has entered 13th year of its existence, and the number of students & courses have increased. A difficulty was experienced for holding seminars/functions/placement activities in the college and necessity of an Auditorium was observed. The matter for construction of an Auditorium was initially taken up in the 10th meeting of Building & Works Committee and it was decided to take up the work of new building in the Task Force and the recommendations of the Task Force be put up in the Building & Works Committee. The matter was discussed in the meetings of Task Force Committee held on 28.10.2005, 16.11.2005 and 17.1.2006. The recommendations of the Task Force Committee were discussed in the 11th meeting of Buildings & Works Committee held on 29.3.2006 and it was suggested to carry out certain amendments in the drawings. It was desired that the detailed estimates and drawings be got prepared again and got checked up through the Chief Architect, Punjab and Executive Engineer, PWD B&R, Pathankot. After getting the drawings checked from the Chief Architect, Punjab and estimates checked from the Executive Engineer, PWD B&R, Pathankot, the matter was again taken up in the 12th meeting of Building & Works Committee held on 09.7.2007 and it was resolved to defer the item for the time being and the matter of construction about Auditorium need to be discussed with the Chairman, Board of Governors before approving the same. The photocopies of minutes of the meetings of Buildings & Works Committee and Task Force are placed at **Annexure XII** from page 238 to 272 as per the revised estimate submitted by M/S NBCC Limited on 13.10.2006 and duly checked by Executive Engineer, PWD B&R, the cost comes to Rs.56248373.00 as per the details given below:

Item #8.14 To adopt the pay scale of Registrar as followed in other Engineering Colleges.

At present, the post of the Registrar is existing in this college in the pay scale of Rs.14300-20100/- with special allowance of Rs.600/- per month. The Registrar is Heading the Sections like Establishment, Finance & Accounts and Store & Purchase and looking after the administrative matters of the college. Thus, he is heading important and full fledged sections of the college. It is also mentioned herein that the similar institutions i.e. NIT, Jalandhar and PEC, Chandigarh are following the pay scale of Rs.16400-22400/- for the post of Registrar. The copies are placed at **Annexure XIV** page 279.

Keeping in view the nature of post and the practice followed in the nearby institutions in Punjab, it is proposed that the pay scale of Registrar be adopted as Rs.16400-22400/- with no special allowance.

The matter is placed before the board for consideration please.

Item #8.15 To approve the expansion of Engineering College under NABARD project.

As per the decision of the Government of Punjab vide # 170 TE/P/1440-1456 dated 05.11.2007 to convert existing institutions into Academies, a polytechnic and pre-university (Science) and pre-engineering level classes (Science Stream) are to be started in the college. The details received from the Director, Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab is placed at **Annexure XV** from page 282 to 283. The college has land and funds are to be provided by NABARD for setting up of Polytechnic and Pre-Engg. School. Detailed Project Report has already been submitted to the Director, Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab.

The matter is placed before the board for approval please.

Item # 8.16 To give more autonomy to Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur for its independent growth.

As per Memorandum of Association, the Principal is the Chief Executive & Academic Officer of the college and as per Bye Laws of the college, he/she has been given powers to deal with the day to day affairs of the college. But, the certain cases which should have been dealt at the level of Principal are sent either to Director, TE & IT, Punjab or Principal Secretary, TE & IT, Punjab for decision. It would be more proper, if the Principal of the college is given more autonomy and administrative powers for dealing with the cases upto the level of Lecturer including Lecturer (Senior Scale) and Lecturer (Selection Grade), so as to avoid delay. However, cases relating to Assistant Professors, Professors and Registrars are to be sent the Chairman, Board of Governors through Secretary, TE & IT, Punjab. The following powers/autonomy should be given to the Principal of the college:

- All cases of appointments, promotions and placement (teaching & non-teaching staff) upto the level of Lecturer (Selection Grade) as per College Bye Laws and AICTE notifications.
- All disciplinary cases (teaching & non-teaching staff) upto the level of Lecturer (Selection Grade) as per rules laid down in College Bye Laws.
- 3. Any other matter not covered in respect of teaching and non-teaching staff upto the level of Lecturer (Selection Grade).

The matter is placed before the board for consideration and approval please.

Item #8.17 To approve the disposing off of plot measuring about 4 kanals.

Initially, the notification for acquisition of about 160 acres land was made. But later on, about 90 acres of land was denotified. With the denotification of 90 acres of land, there is no continuity of plot measuring four kanals with the existing college premises and it cannot be utilized for any purpose by the college. Rather, the college has to make expenditure to keep the land safe from unauthorized encroachments. Presently, the land of the college is in three parts as per the drawing attached:

Plot 1 ➤ 62 acres – Existing College

Plot 2 ➤ 07 acres – Proposed 10+2 School

Plot 3 ➤ 4 Kanals

The decision regarding dispose off of this plot 3 of land measuring about 4 kanals needs to be taken at the Board level.

Item # 8.18 To regularize the adhoc services of Lecturer in Computer Science & Engineering.

Shri Rajeev Kumar Bedi, Lecturer (CS&E) who is working on adhoc basis has represented his case to the Hon'ble Technical Education Minister Cum Chairmen, Board of Governors to regularize his adhoc service. Hon'ble Technical Education Minister-cum-Chairman, Board of Governors, has desired to include in the agenda for consideration of his case. His remarks are "please consider sympathetically and report".

An interview for the post of Lecturer in Computer Science & Engineering was conducted on 29-8-2002 by the Staff Selection Committee duly approved by the Govt. of Punjab including representative of the Government. Shri Rajeev Kumar Bedi was recommended for appointment as Lecturer on adhoc basis for a period of six months in the pay scale of Rs.8000-13500/- against the vacant post. Accordingly, he was issued appointment letter vide this office letter No BCET/GSP/2002/4916 dated 02-09-2002. Subsequently, he jointed his duties on 03-09-2002 and after completion of the said period, he was relieved on 28-02-2003. Later on, he has worked on Lecture basis during the months of March, 2003 and again in August 2003 to 12th October, 2003. He was further appointed as Lecturer in the pay scale of Rs. 8000-13500/- on adhoc basis for 89 days w.e.f. 13-10-2003 vide No. BCET/Estt./03/8229 dated 09-10-2003. He was relieved on 09-01-2004.

Again in compliance to the instructions of the Government of Punjab Department of Technical Education & Industrial Training, vide memo No. 2/9/04-5TE/168 dated 14-01-2004 and memo No. 2/9/04-5TE/747 dated 3/3/2004, he was appointed as Lecturer on adhoc basis w.e.f. 15-01-2004 till the post is filled up on regular basis. He is working on this post with all the benefits applicable to the persons appointed on regular basis. Regular post of Lecturer in Computer Science & Engineering is vacant against which he is working on adhoc basis with all benefits. At the time of his appointment, all the posts were used to be filled up on regular basis and he

was selected by the same committee which recommended the names of other candidates for regular appointments. Ever since of his working in this college, his work and conduct has been found satisfactory and there has never been any complaint from any quarter. The copies of his appointment letters including minutes of Staff Selection Committee along with copies of correspondence with the Govt. of Punjab are placed at **Annexure XVI** from page 284 to 301. It is proposed that his services be regularized keeping in view of his experience, work and conduct in this college.

Matter is placed before the board for consideration please.

Item #8.19 To approve the extension in the services of the persons working on adhoc/contract basis for a period of three years.

Keeping in view the public interest, the following employees were appointed on adhoc/contract basis as recommended/approved by Chairman, Board of Governors and Govt. of Punjab from the dates as shown against their names with the usual break:

- 1. Shri Deepak Kaila, Computer Operator since 21.06.2004.
- 2. Shri Hardeep Singh, Laboratory Attendant since 05.07.2004
- 3. Shri Jagjit Singh, Laboratory Assistant since 26.10.2004.
- 4. Ms. Charanjit, Assistant Store Keeper since 22.11.2004.
- 5. Shri Ravinder Singh, Maintenance Supervisor since 06.01.2006.

They represented their case to the Hon'ble Technical Education Minister, Punjab-cum-Chairman, Board of Governors, BCET, Gurdaspur who inturn has asked to "Pease. put up in the agenda of the BoG meeting". They were initially appointed for a period of six months/one year and they are continuing with the approval from Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors and Worthy Principal Secretary, Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab.

The matter for converting their services into contract for a period of three years was taken up in the 7th meeting of Board of Governors held on 15.11.2006 vide agenda item # 7.11. In the meeting, it was decided that they be allowed to continue till the regular incumbents join as the test for recruitment was to be conducted in December 2006. But the process has still not been completed even though the test was conducted. During their period of services in the college, their work and conduct has been found satisfactory and copies of their annual confidential reports for the year 2006-2007 are placed at **Annexure XVII** from page 302 to 307. It is mentioned herein that they full fill the requisite qualification & experience for the posts.

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Keeping in view the requirement and their eligibility for the posts/performance in the past, it is proposed that their services may be

extended on contract basis for a period of three years (with pay +DP+IR+DA) and renewable which can be renewed further depending on their performance and requirement of the college.

Item #8.20 To absorb the services of Staff Nurse.

More than 200 girl students are staying in the Girl's Hostels of the college and more than 100 families are staying in the college campus. There is only one post of Staff Nurse in the college and the services of Mrs. Surjit Kaur have been taken as Staff Nurse on deputation from Giani Zail Singh College of Engineering & Technology, Bathinda w.e.f. 13.9.2005 for a period of three years as per orders of the Govt. of Punjab vide # 2/40/05-055.TE.2/2584 dated 07.9.2005 (copy placed at **Annexure XVIII** page 308.) During her stay in this college, her work and conduct has been found up to the mark.

Looking into the requirement of the college and work and conduct of Mrs. Surjit Kaur, Staff Nurse, it is proposed that her services may kindly be absorbed in this college.
