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### Item No. 16.1 Confirmation of the minutes of 15<sup>th</sup> meeting of Board of Governors held on 19.2.2015

The 15<sup>th</sup> meeting of Board of Governors of Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur was held on 19.2.2015 at Conference Hall, Directorate of Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab, Chandigarh. Minutes of the meeting were circulated to all the members vide No. BCET/Estt./20154/669-676 dated 05.3.2015 for comments, if any (placed at Annexure page 35 - 38).

Comment was received from the office of DTE/IT, Punjab regarding implementation of reservation policy for recruitment of teaching & non-teaching posts in the college (Item No.15.4). The office of the DTE/IT Punjab has advised vide memo No.595/S-3/ECC/2015 dated 16.4.2015 stating that AICTE New Delhi grants department-wise approval to the technical institutions. Similarly, NBA also grants department wise accreditation to such institutions (Annexure page 39). Therefore, as per previous practice, the roster point should also be maintained department-wise as already implemented in the polytechnic institutions of the state. Accordingly, as per the advice of the office of DTE/IT, Punjab, roster registers are maintained department wise in the college

Finance Committee is as under:

.... It was decided to give the benefit of ACP/placement to the 07 remaining non-teaching employees by ratifying their case of regularization of services whose services were regularized on 24.10.2011. However, they should not be given any promotion to the next higher post without acquiring qualification requisite for higher post..... Proceedings of  $34^{th}$  meeting of Finance Committee are placed at **Annexure page 41 – 46**.

Accordingly, the due benefits of ACP/Placement were extended to the concerned employees (Annexure page 47 - 48).

13.14 Review of cases of Teaching & Non-Teaching employees forwarded to PSTE&IT and DTE&IT, Punjab on single file as decision taken in the different meetings of the college Finance Committee.

Decision The Board noted the action taken and further directed to put up this item as fresh agenda item in the next BOG meeting.

All the cases of Teaching and Non-teaching employees were put in the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of Finance Committee as Agenda Item No.29.6 held on 30.3.2015. The decision of the Finance Committee is reproduced below:

.... The proposed budget for the release of arrears to the faculty/staff appointed after 01.1.2006 was approved by the Finance Committee....

In compliance to the above decision, the due arrears were paid to concerned faculty and staff as per Annexure page 49 - 50. Proceedings of  $29^{th}$  meeting of Finance Committee are placed at Annexure page 51 - 52.

To advise in the retirement case of Dr. Dial Chand, Professor, Department of Applied Sciences, Humanities & Management for the release of withheld retirement benefits and other dues.

Decision

The Board noted the action taken and further directed that the enquiry officer Dr. Jasbir Singh Hundal, Director, Giani Zail Singh Punjab Technical University Campus, Bathinda may be requested to complete the enquiry of Dr. Dial Chand and submit the report as soon as possible.

Action

The enquiry officer has submitted the report and the same is submitted before the Board for consideration please (Annexure pages 53 - 55).

To report the conviction pronounced against Sh. Inderpal Singh, Registrar (presently working on deputation at SBS Technical Campus, Ferozepur) in FIR No. 43, dated 19-10-2009, registered by Vigilance Bureau, Amritsar.

Decision

The Board deliberated the conviction case of Sh. Inderpal Singh in detail. The Board also noted the appeal filed by Sh. Inderpal Singh in the High Court wherein his imprisonment has been suspended during the pendency of the appeal. The Board was informed about the corruption charges case of Sh. Naginder Singh Bhatia, Principal Grade-I Industrial Training Institute, Ferozepur, who was retired prematurely by the Punjab Govt. vide order of the Governor of Punjab bearing Endst. No. 1/19/02-ITE(1) 1195 dated 13-07-2006(copy enclosed). The Board examined the issue and decided that it would be in the public interest that Sh. Inderpal Singh is not retained in the public Service and a major penalty is required to be imposed on the ground of conduct which has led to his conviction on a criminal charge.

Accordingly, the Board decided that Sh. Inderpal Singh may be removed from the post of Registrar BCET, Gurdaspur with immediate effect by giving him compulsory retirement in reference to Punjab Govt. Circular letter No. 3/23/98-IPPII/10394 dated 05-08-1998 issued by Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms. However, no decision was taken by the Board regarding release of his retirement benefits, and therefore his service benefits may be withheld till the decision of the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Action

As per the decision taken by the Board of Governors, Sh. Inderpal Singh, Registrar was removed from the post of Registrar with immediate effect by giving him compulsory retirement vide office order No. BCET/513 dated 26.2.2015. The CPF

of the concerned official was released vide this office letter No.BCET/Acctts. /2015/1821 dated 01.6.2015.

(Annexure page 56 - 57).

### 15.4 Regarding implementation of reservation policy for recruitment of teaching and non-teaching posts in the college.

Decision

The Board approved the same as proposed.

Action

In compliance with the advice of DTE/IT Punjab received vide memo No. 595/S-3/ECC/2015 dated 16.4.2015 (Annexure page 39), no further action has been taken in this regard. The Govt. has advised to maintain the roster register as per previous practice i.e. department wise. Accordingly, roster registers are maintained department wise.

### 15.5 To grant some fixed annual incentive to faculty members appointed on contract

basis for the period of one year on consolidated pay of Rs. 21600/-.

Decision In order to retain well qualified faculty and keeping view the annual enhancement

#### Item No. 16.3 Starting of new courses-regarding

In the month of November 2018, Hon'ble Minister for Technical Education and Industrial Training, Punjab, Sh. Charanjit Singh Channi Ji visited this college and had one-to-one interaction with faculty and staff members regarding functioning/performance/reputation of the college in the Punjab and its surrounding areas. Hon'ble Minister then asked Principal of the college to constitute committee to prepare a proposal for improving financial and academic status of the institute. The report of duly constituted committee is enclosed herewith (Annexure page 58 – 70).

Keeping in view the admission scenario in the surroundings of BCET other universities, and college is proposing the following courses to be introduced in the forthcoming session (2019-20):-

i. BCA with initial intake of 60

students (Non-AICTE Course)


- ii. Bachelor of Commerce (Hons) with initial intake of 60 students (Non-AICTE Course)
- iii. B.Sc. (Biotechnology) with initial intake of 60 students (Non-AICTE Course)
- iv. Diploma in Civil Engineering with initial intake of 60 students (AICTE Course)
- v. M. Tech. in CSE with initial intake of 18 students (AICTE Course)

For BCA and M. Tech (CSE), college does not need new faculty because most of the courses are related to Computer Science, Information Technology and Mathematics, so the existing faculty at BCET (Engg wing and Poly wing) will teach the various courses of BCA.

For B.Com (Hons), in the very first year of program, we need 1 faculty member, subsequently 2 faculty members in 2<sup>nd</sup> year and then 2 more in the final year. Rest of courses will be taught by existing faculty of Computer Science, Information Technology, Mechanical Engineering and Mathematics (Engg wing and Poly wing).

For Diploma in Civil Engineering, college needs to appoint 4 faculty members in phased manner to teach courses of Diploma in Civil engineering. Some of courses will be taught by existing faculty (Engg wing and Poly wing). In the very first year of diploma program in Civil Engg, college does not need any new faculty.

To summarize, the faculty positions for new courses will be as follows:-



Item No. 16.4 Restoring of financial assistance/grant-in-aid to Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur-regarding.

It is submitted that Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur was established in 1994 by the Government of Punjab for providing Technical Education in the border area of the state. During this period, college has achieved many mile stones like successfully implemented World Bank Project TEQIP-II, NBA Accreditation, UGC Academic Autonomy, NAAC Accreditation etc. Alumni of this college are well placed at higher positions in reputed organizations of International and National importance.

As per letter vide No. PA/DTE/3666 dated 22.12.1994, the college is fully funded by Punjab Govt. (**Annexure page 71**). Annual recurring and non-recurring expenditure has to be fully met by the Punjab Government. The college has received Grant-in-Aid as under:

The college was given annual grant continuously till 2003 by Govt. of Punjab to meet the recurring and non-recurring expenditure.

In the year 2004, the annual grant of privately managed Polytechnics/Engg. Colleges was made nil in view of the sufficient funds collected from students on account of various fee amounts. Surprisingly, the same notification vide No.1/14/2001-2F-/2480 dated 19.3.2001 was also implemented on Govt. established Engg. Colleges of the state including BCET, Gurdaspur (Annexure Page 72). During the same year (2004), the annual grant of privately managed & funded Polytechnics was restored by the Govt. of Punjab vide Endst. No. 328 – 31 dated 26.2.2004 (Annexure page 73). But, as of now, the annual grant of BCET, Gurdaspur and other Govt. established Engg. Colleges have not been restored on the same pattern.

This college was running and growing smoothly without any financial problem till the year 2015. However, since 2015, the financial position of the institute started weakening

due to increase in recurring and non-recurring expenditure. Consequently, growth of the college has been hampered, quality and strength of intake at the time of admissions got deteriorated.

The Director, TE & IT, Punjab vide this office letter No. BCET/7043 dated 10.12.2018 was requested to restore the regular grant to this college (**Annexure page 74** – **75**) and in response vide memo No.106 dated 18.1.2019, it has been directed to put the matter before the Board of Governors of this college (**Annexure page 76**).

It is pertinent to mention that around 25 Govt. Polytechnics and around 112 Govt. ITIs are meeting out recurring and non-recurring expenditures through the State Exchequer. The financial burden of our institute on the State Exchequer will be very less as compared to the said Polytechnic Colleges and ITIs. It is also important to mention that during recent audit, AG Punjab officials have pointed out that recurring and non-recurring expenditure the college are to be met by Govt. of Punjab and efforts are to be made by the college to get the grant released (**Annexure 77**).

Therefore, in view the above facts it is requested:

• To restore the regular Grant-in-Aid to this college.

OR

 The Govt. of Punjab should take-over the college as per para 6 (page 81) of Memorandum of Association (Annexure page 78 – 83).

#### Item No. 16.5 Ratification of three appointments made on compassionate grounds.

It is informed that Sh. Tarlok Chand, who was working as workshop instructor, expired. Thereafter, on the request of his wife Mrs. Parveen Lata, the case of Ms. Shiffa Changotra was sent to the office of DTE/IT Punjab for appointing her on compassionate grounds. The office of DTE/IT Punjab vide memo No.1594 dated 06.9.2017 has intimated that Principal of the College is competent to offer job on compassionate grounds for Group C & D employees (Annexure page 84) as referred in the Punjab Govt. Notification No.11/5/98/4PPII/14420 dated 21.11.2002. Accordingly, Ms. Shiffa Changotra, daughter of Late Sh. Tarlok Chand had been appointed as Clerk vide No.BCET/2947 dated 07.9.2017 (Annexure page 85 – 86).

In the second case, Sh. Ashok Kumar, Senior Technician had expired while performing service in this college. As requested by his wife Mrs. Amandeep Kaur for employment on compassionate grounds, the case was sent to the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors and the same was approved. Accordingly, Mrs. Amandeep Kaur, wife of Late Sh. Ashok Kumar had been appointed as Clerk vide No.BCET/ESTT/2015/1257 dated 20.4.2015 (Annexure page 87 – 88).

In another case, Sh. Maan Singh Negi, workings as Peon expired. On the request of his wife Mrs. Saraswati Devi, the case of his younger son Mr. Jagmohan Singh was considered and discussed in the 35<sup>th</sup> meeting of Finance Committee (agenda Item No. 35.13) and the same was approved (Annexure page 134). Accordingly, Sh. Jagmohan Singh s/o Late Sh. Maan Singh Negi has been appointed as Peon vide No.BCET/5752 dated 30.8.2018 (Annexure page 89 – 90).

This item is submitted for kind consideration and ratification please.

Item No. 16.6 To ratify the permanently absorption of services of Dr. Nripjit, Associate Professor of SBS Technical Campus, Ferozepur who was on deputation in this college.

Dr. Nripjit, Associate Professor, SBS Technical Campus, Ferozepur was working in this college on deputation basis with the directions of Director, TE & IT, Punjab and the same was extended from time to time.

Thereafter, as approved by Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors vide Note No.BCET/2405 dated 16.7.2015, the services of Dr. Nripjit, Associate Professor were permanently absorbed in this college against the post of Assistant Professor w.e.f. 18.7.2015 (Annexure page 91 – 92).

The matter is submitted before BOG for kind consideration and ratification please.

### Item No.16.7 Approval of rates for hiring the services of lawyers to defend/represent the college before different Hon'ble Courts.

As per record, an approval to pay fee to the advocates was taken on 18.6.2005 from Hon'ble Principal Secretary, TE & IT, Punjab as under (Annexure page 93):

High Court Rs.5500+500 as typing/stationary charges

Lower Court Rs.2200+250 as typing/stationary charges

Thereafter, another approval vide Note memo # BCET/112 dated 10.1.2017 was taken from the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors for engaging advocate at the rate of Rs.1,50,000/- (legal fee) plus Rs.1,00,000/- (for stay orders) for income tax case (**Annexure page 94** – **95**). It is submitted that the charges for hiring the services of senior lawyers are applicable according to the nature and importance of the case. As per survey of the market, there are no fixed service charges in this regard. It is therefore proposed to approve the existing rates of SBSSTC Ferozepur for this college for normal cases. However, in cases of special nature (income tax etc.), it is proposed to hire the advocates by collecting rates from the reputed lawyers of the respective courts by constituting a committee consisting of three Heads of the Departments and Registrar of the college.

The matter is submitted before BOG for kind consideration and approval please.

## Item No.16.8 Uniformity in grant of extension in contract services in respect of Teaching and administrative/non-teaching employees.

It is submitted that during the years 2008 and 2009, teaching, administrative and non-teaching employees have been appointed on contract basis in the regular pay scale for three years. As approved by the then Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors vide Note No.BCET/3498 dated 27.8.2008 and No.BCET/5613 dated 12.11.2008, (Annexure page 98 – 99), the contract of such employees had to be extended in the blocks of two years, whereas, this contract is being extended for different durations (i.e. six months, one year or two years etc.) resultantly, the resentment has been found amongst the employees which hampers the peaceful and smooth functioning of the academic environment.

Out of total twenty eight (28) employees working on contract basis in the regular pay scale, there are fourteen (14) employees who were granted extension in their contract service till the constitution of Board of Governors or up to 31.3.2019 (Annexure page 100 - 104). The detail of ACRs i/r of these 14 employees is placed at Annexure page 100.

It is proposed that extension in contract period may be given for further period of 02 years for all those employees whose have either completed their contract period or will complete up to 31.03.2019. However, the decision, if any, from Hon'ble Courts in any case shall be applicable.

### Item No. 16.13 To ratify the decisions of combined meeting of Principals of Government Promoted Engineering College held on 25.7.2014.

It is intimated that the meeting of Principals of Govt. Promoted Engg. Colleges was held on 25.7.2014 for disposal of the pending cases of various colleges. The office of DTE/IT has informed vide memo No. 1215-1218/ECC/2015 dated 27.7.2015 (Annexure page 165 – 167) that the proceedings of the Principal's meeting held on 25.07.2014 has already been approved by Hon'ble Technical Education Minister, Punjab. In compliance to these proceedings, the posts of Photo State Operator/Duplicate Machine Operator and Care Taker-cum-Manager (Hostels) vide office order No. BCET/750 dated 06.3.2018 and No. BCET/308 dated 30.1.2018 have been merged as Clerk subject to ratification of Hon'ble Board of Governors (Annexure page 168-169).

However, the matter was discussed vide Item No.34.12 in the 34th meeting of Finance Committee and the following decision was taken:

..... It was discussed that while implementing the decision of Principal's meeting at Shaheed Bhagat Singh State Technical Campus, Ferozepur, they have given higher grade pay to some categories of employees than that paid by Punjab Govt. and their case is under review, therefore, it was decided not to approve this item ....

In view of the decision taken by the Finance Committee, it is proposed that the decisions regarding pay scales finalized in the Principals meeting may be kept pending and rest of the decisions taken in Principal's meeting dated 25.07.2014 may be ratified.

It is submitted that in the year 1994, the Purchase Rules for this College were adopted from GZS College of Engg. & Tech., Bathinda along with its Bye Laws. As of now, after more than 24 years, no change or amendment in these rules has been made. The same Bye Laws were also adopted by SBSSTC, Ferozepur in the same year and lots of amendments have been made in these rules by SBSSTC, Ferozepur.

Further, it is informed that the DTE & IT, Punjab vide its memo # 1843-47/ECC/99/F-130 dated 28.9.1999, has sent a copy of AICTE Comprehensive Stores & Purchase Rules to the following Govt. promoted Engg. colleges for comments and with an advice to adopt the same in the institute:

- i) Principal, REC, Jalandhar
- iv) Principal, BCET, Gurdaspur
- ii) Principal, GZSCET, Bathinda) Principal, SBSCET, Ferozepur
- iii) Principal, MIMIT, Malout

A copy of DTE/IT memo # 1843-47/ECC/99/F-130 dated 28.9.1999 along with AICTE Comprehensive Stores & Purchase Rules is placed at **Annexure** Page 170 – 196.

The AICTE Comprehensive Stores & Purchase Rules have already been adopted by the Punjab State Government Promoted Engineering Colleges namely, SBSSTC, Ferozepur (**Annexure page 197 – 200**), MIMIT, Malout and BHSBCET, Lehragaga.

The matter was discussed in the 35<sup>th</sup> meeting of Finance Committee as Item No.35.6 and the item was dropped with the decision that it falls in the purview of BOGs of the college (**Annexure page 134**). It is therefore proposed that approval may please be given to adopt the aforesaid AICTE Comprehensive Stores & Purchase Rules, which have already been adopted by other state managed engineering colleges.

The matter is submitted before BOG for kind consideration and approval please.

## Item No. 16.15 Implementation of pension scheme for regular employees of Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur who joined service before 08.7.2012.

Some employees of this college had sent a representation to the office of DTE/IT for implementation of Pension Scheme in the college. The office of DTE/IT had forwarded the said representations vide memo No. 884/S-4/ECC/2018 dated 22.6.2018 to college for comment (Annexure page 201 – 203).

It is informed that two colleges namely Beant College of Engg. & Tech., Gurdaspur and SBS State Technical Campus, Ferozepur were established by Govt. of Punjab in 1995.

As per clause 8.1 of College Bye Laws, the pension fund is required to be established by creating corpus fund by transferring CPF contribution made by the college along with interest accrued thereon. The same has already been implemented in the Punjab Govt. established college namely SBSCET, Ferozepur. The Board of Governors of this college vide approved minutes of Agenda Item # 4.8, has also approved this pension scheme for the employees in this college (placed at **Annexure page 204)**. However, the same has not been implemented in this college, so far.

After 17 years, the case of the aforesaid pension scheme was again put before the Board of Governors for approval in respect of the employees who joined on or before 31.3.2004. The matter was discussed in the 14<sup>th</sup> meeting of Hon'ble Board of Governors and it was advised to explore other avenues like LIC Pension Plan, National Pension Scheme etc. for the same, if possible.

In this regard, it is submitted that the pension schemes framed by LIC or other similar agencies are not beneficial for the employees having more than 15 years of length of service in this college.

Considering all above aspects and the future of college employees, it is proposed that the pension scheme as provided in the College Bye Laws Clause 8.1, which has already been approved by Board of Governors as Agenda Item 4.8 and already implemented in other similar Punjab Government Engg. Colleges (SBS State Technical Campus, Ferozepur, GZS College of Engg. & Tech, Bathinda) and as demanded by the employees of this college may kindly be approved to implement at BCET Gurdaspur.

# Item No. 16.16 Reporting of AICTE report regarding deficiency of faculty for giving extension of approval (EOA) and regularization of the services of existing contractual faculty working on the regular pay scale.

Recently, AICTE vide ref. NWRO/AICTE/ALL STATE GOVT./2018-19 dated 24.01.2019, No. NWRP/AICTE/State Govt./2018-19 dated 30.10.2018 and subsequent instructions issued by Director TE&IT, Punjab vide memo No.109-114 dated 22.1.2019 has pointed out that most of the Govt. institutions are having deficiency related to faculty and if this deficiency is not removed then in future extension of approval will not be granted to run the courses. (Annexure page 205 – 208). AICTE generally calculates the deficiency in faculty on the basis of sanctioned intake, not on actual admissions. Dean, Academic Affairs vide No.BCET/Acad/135 dated 12.2.2019 (Annexure page 209) has also informed that AICTE, New Delhi has raised objection regarding deficiency of Regular Faculty in the college. This can hamper the continuation of extension of approval (EOA) for Degree Courses in Engineering and Technology from AICTE, New Delhi, in future. Moreover, if the College is having any deficiency, then it could not apply for addition of new course. Simultaneously, it will also affect the accreditation of courses from NBA, NAAC and continuation of UGC Autonomous status. Admission scenario will also be affected due to the deficiency of Faculty.

However, in the present scenario of admission, the actual intake at BCET is low, so at present, we have sufficient number of faculty members (Regular and Contractual) to run the existing courses. In the years 2008 and 2009, nine (09) teachers were appointed on contract basis in the regular pay scale plus allowances initially for a period of three years and, subsequently, their tenure was extended from time to time. Further, some of the faculty members working on contract basis, have also requested to regularize their services (Annexure Page 210). They have already served the college for more than 09 years on contract basis. All these faculty members were recruited following the due procedure as per bye-laws through direct recruitment. The detail of ACRs and results for the last two years i/r of these nine teachers are placed at Annexure page 211 – 221.

They are already drawing pay equivalent to regular faculty members and they have been recruited by constituting selection committee as per college bye-laws through direct method, if their services are regularized, it will not be having any

additional financial burden on the college.

Therefore, it is proposed that in the light of policy framed in the year 2011, the services of these nine faculty members may be regularized for continuation of NBA/NAAC Accreditation and UGC Autonomous status, and to avoid objection from AICTE, New Delhi.

Item No. 16.17 Sanction of the faculty positions and staff positions in the Departments of B.Sc. Honors (Agriculture Science) & B.Tech(Civil Engineering) and approval for filling up of these posts on regular basis.

It is submitted that College has started B.Sc. Honors (Agriculture Science) Course from the academic year 2018-2019 with the due approval of IKG Punjab Technical University with an annual intake of 60 students. All the seats have been filled during the academic session 2018-2019. In the academic year 2019-2020, the classes of B.Sc. Honors (Agriculture Science) will enter in the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester. Similarly, another UG Programme of B.Tech. in Civil Engineering was started in the college in the academic year 2016-2017 with annual intake of 60 students and faculty positions are still to be filled for the same. There are only four faculty members working on a consolidated pay of Rs.15,000/- per month in this department. As per AICTE/IKGPTU guidelines, the teacher student ratio is 1:20 and accordingly the following number of faculty posts are required to be sanctioned to run these course in the ratio of 1:2:6:

Further, Heads of Departments of Civil Engineering and B.Sc. Hons (Agriculture Sciences) have requested to recruit the faculty of the level of Assistant Professors as per below to meet the requirement as per AICTE/IKGPTU guidelines (Annexure page 222 – 223):

Further the following staff is required to run the Department of B. Tech. Civil Engineering and B.Sc. Hons (Agriculture Science) effectively and efficiently;

Clerk 1 (one) and Laboratory Attendants 2 (two).

It is therefore proposed to approve the sanction and filling of faculty positions of Assistant Professors, 1 Clerk and 2 Laboratory Attendants as per above at the institute level on regular basis to run these courses effectively and to avoid any legal complications from AICTE/IKGPTU Jalandhar.

The complete matter is submitted before BOG for kind consideration and approval please.

### Item No. 16.18 To approve the panel of Experts for recruitment of Faculty, promotion of Faculty under CAS and recruitment of Non-Teaching Employees.

As per clause 2.9 of the College Bye-Laws, a panel of external experts in various subjects should be approved by the Board of Governors of the College (Annexure page 224) and External Experts shall be appointed from this panel.

Therefore, the proposed panel of external experts for different cadres and subjects for filling the vacant positions of Faculty, promotion of Faculty under CAS and recruitment of Non-Teaching Employees are placed at (Annexure page 225 – 236).

#### Item No. 16.19 Re-designation of the position of Principal as Director.

Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur was established by Government of Punjab in 1994 to impart technical education in the border area. Initially, the college started B.Tech Programmes in three streams. In due course of time, four new B. Tech. Programmes along with three (03) Master's Degree Programmes and one B.Sc. Hons. (Agriculture Sc.) Programmes have been added. Besides this two more wings namely Polytechnic and School (10+1 and 10+2 Non Medical Sc. Stream) have been started as detailed below:

#### Item No. 16.20 Sanction of post of Superintendent Grade II and Asstt. Registrar-regarding.

In the year 1995, the college started B.Tech Programmes in three streams i.e. Computer Sc. & Engg., Mechanical Engineering and Production Engineering. In the due course of time, four new B. Tech. Programmes along with three (03) Master's Degree Programmes and one B.Sc. Hons. (Agriculture Sc.) programmes have been added. Besides this two more wings namely Polytechnic and School (10+1 and 10+2 Non Medical Sc. Stream) have been started. The college has also been granted Academic Autonomy. As a result, the work load on administrative posts has increased tremendously and supervisory staff is required for smooth functioning. Presently, there are three posts of Superintendent Grade II, whereas, at least five Superintendent Grade II are required to supervise the work load of different sections i.e. Establishment, Accounts, Store & Purchase, Examination Section, Polytechnic and School Wing. Presently, there are only three posts of Superintendent Grade II. At SBSSTC Ferozepur, there are 05 posts of Superintendent grade-II. There are 03 sanctioned posts of Assistant Registrars.

Considering above facts, it is proposed to approve 01 more post of Superintendent Grade II and one more post of Asstt. Registrar. These posts will be filled through promotion only from the existing staff. Since the existing employees are already drawing pay more than the initial start of their next positions, hence there will be no extra financial burden.

# Item No. 16.21 Personal promotion channel for the post of Pharmacist, Staff Nurse, Maintenance supervisor, Junior draftsman and Personal Assistant to Principal -regarding.

It is submitted that there is no promotion channel in the college promotion criteria for the posts of Pharmacist, Staff Nurse, Maintenance Supervisor, Junior Draftsman and PA to Principal. The concerned officials have requested to grant them promotions as per Punjab Government promotion criteria. They are working on single cadre post and there is no promotion criteria in the college for them.

In this regard, a copy of Notification No.G.S.R.13/Const./Art.309/2018 dated 23.3.2018 and Punjab Govt. Gaz. (Extra), March 23,2018 is placed at **Annexure page 237 – 241**, which shows the promotion criteria as under:

Pharmacist - Punjab Govt. Gaz. (Extra), March 23,2018

- a) Chief Pharmacist Grade -2 From amongst the Pharmacists, who are member of Group-C Service and who have an experience of working as such for a minimum period of ten years.
- b) Chief Pharmacist Grade 1 From amongst the Chief Pharmacists Grade-2 who have and experience of working as such for a minimum period of two years.

Staff Nurse - Punjab Govt. Gaz. (Extra), March 23,2018

- a) **Nursing Sister** From amongst the Staff Nurses, who are member of Group-C Service, who opt to become Nursing sister and who have an experience of working as such for a minimum period of ten years.
- b) **Sister Tutor** From amongst Staff Nurses, who are members of Group-C Service and who opt to become Sister Tutor who have an experience of working as such for a minimum period of ten years, and who possess the requisite qualifications prescribed for direct appointment of Sister Tutor.

Junior Draftsman - Notification No. 7/33/2011-3FPI/150 dated 19.3.2012 (Annexure page 242)

.....In Part B of the Second Schedule, in all entries relating to Draftsman and Junior Draftsman, the minimum period experience of 12 years of service as Junior Draftsman prescribed for promotion as Draftsman, shall be substituted by the minimum period experience 5 years of service as Junior Draftsman.....

Maintenance Supervisor (Electrical): Maintenance supervisor can be

promoted as Maintenance Engineer (Electrical) as per the promotion criteria already approved.

**Personal Assistant to Principal**: Similarly, there is no promotion channel in the college promotion criteria for the posts of Personal Assistant to Principal. Therefore, Personal Assistant to Principal may be promoted as Private Secretary to Principal.

It is proposed to approve the above said promotion criteria for the post of Pharmacist, Staff Nurse, Maintenance supervisor, Junior Draftsman, and Personal Assistant to Principal as personal to them. When they will retire, the post on which they were recruited will be declared as vacant. Further, no recruitment shall be made on the post on which they were recruited after their promotion.

### Item No. 16.22 Criteria for recruitment of administrative, Non-Teaching/Technical and Supporting staff.

The College was following the criteria prescribed by the office of DTE/IT vide No. 6914 dated 11-11-2010 for selection of various posts of Technical/Non teaching staff wherein interview was conducted for these posts (**Annexure page 243 – 249**). Since the Punjab Govt. vide memo No.12/152/20165^5gh agha2\$720133\$1 dated 28.3.2016 has cancelled the criteria of interview for all Group B (Non Gazetted), Group- C & Group-D (**Annexure page 250**), therefore the above said criteria is required to be changed.

Maharaja Ranjit Singh Punjab Technical University, Bathinda got the new criteria approved in its BOGs meeting held on 07.9.2015 under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Govt. of Punjab. This criteria has already been adopted by SBSSTC, Ferozepur after due approval from its BOGs as per Agenda Item No.30.11 (Annexure page 251 – 257).

Since this selection criteria has been approved by BOG of MRSPTU Bathinda and already been adopted by SBSSTC, Ferozepur, therefore, it is proposed that the same please be approved for this college.

As decided by the office of DTE/IT, CAS from AGP Rs 6000 to Rs. 7000 and AGP from Rs. 7000/- to Rs. 8000/- shall be done at College level. Accordingly, the following "Screening-cum-Evaluation Committee" -12- is proposed for giving the benefit of Carrier Advancement Scheme (CAS) to Asstt. Prof. from AGP Rs.6000 to Rs.7000 and AGP from Rs.7000/- to Rs.8000/- at the college level:

- 1. Principal of the College
- 2. Director of Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab or nominee
- 3. University Nominee
- 4. HOD of Concerned department
- 5. A professor as nominated by Director
- 6. Two subject experts from the concerned department

The quorum for these "Screening-cum-Evaluation Committee" shall be three including one subject expert / University nominee need to be present.
