Item No. 10.3 Budget estimates for the year 2002-2003.

The budget estimates for the year 2002-2003 are proposed keeping in view the requirement of the ongoing buildings and development works, construction of new buildings carried over from previous years due to non release of funds for this purpose, purchase of machinery and equipment and also to provide necessary facilities and infrastructure so as to conduct the curriculum programmes of the college in six courses efficiently.

The college will have 1200 students (approx.) on the campus in six disciplines in the year 2002-2003. It is also mentioned herein that an additional course of Information Technology with an intake of 40 students has been started from the academic year 2001. So, the infrastructure already established is insufficient for meeting the requirement of 1200 students and has to be further strengthened in terms of buildings, staff, furniture, equipment, other facilities, and contingencies. It may be pointed out that the creation of infrastructure has not gone as per Project Report because of gross inadequacy of funds provided during the period from 1995 to 2001 and now the buildings and infrastructure need to be completed on priority as the project has already been considerably delayed. Keeping in view all the factors, the proposed budget estimates including anticipated income at the college level during the year 2002-2003 is kept at Rs. 1570.25 lacs.

JUSTIFICATIONS FOR NON-RECURRING & RECURRING EXPENDITURE

NOS-RECURRING

A. Land.

At the time of possession of land for the college in the year 1993-94, some of the farmers took a stay in the honourable Punjab & Harayana High Court, Chandigarh and only 70 acres of land could be possessed. In the year 2001, an agreement reached between the farmers and the Government. Accordingly, two farmers namely Shri Mittar Mann Singh and Shri Davinder Singh agreed to give the land measuring 32 acres (approximately). A committee under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner, Gurdaspur was constituted for negotiating the rates for acquisition of 32 acres of land for the college. A meeting under the chairmanship of Shri K.A.P. Sinha, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, Gurdaspur held on 22.4.2002 recommended the rates as mentioned below:

1. Bariar

Rs. 18.50 lacs per acre.

2. Khojepur

Rs. 11.50 lacs per acre.

Keeping in view the rates recommended by the negotiating committee, a total approximately amount payable comes to Rs. 560.00 lacs. At this time, an amount of Rs. 39.00 lacs is lying with the SDM, Gurdspur and Rs. 45.00 lacs is lying with the college for the purpose of acquiring the land. Therefore, in case, this land is acquired, an additional amount of Rs. 4/6 lacs will be required. Hence, a provision of Rs. 480 lacs has been made in this budget keeping in view the small variation at the time of making the payment. A copy of the proceedings about fixing the rate per acre is placed at ANNEXURE – II (pages from 23 to 28).

B. Buildings & Development Works

The project report for the college prepared by the Educational Consultants India Limited (Ed.CIL) provides the buildings requirements as follows:

1.	Institutional Complex	14052 m ²
2.	Administrative Complex	3739 m ²

Ongoing Works

Chemical Block (partial completion of 1600 m²

The total area for Chemical Block was 4357 m² but due to scarcity of funds, the construction could be started only on 1600 m². For this partial completion, a provision of Rs. 90.00 lacs was made in the budget of 1999-2000. But the same also could not be completed due to non-release of funds. Since the project has already been delayed, it proposed to complete the building measuring 4357 m² and for this, an amount of Rs. 170.00 lacs was proposed during the year 2001-2002. But in the absence of sufficient funds, the building could not be comleted. However, an amount of Rs. 20.00 lacs is required to complete the 1600 m² partial block.

Single Seater Boy's Hostel

A provision of Rs.50.00 lacs was made during the year 2001-2002 for completion of the balance work on the hostel. But due to non release of funds, the hostel still could not be completed and the amount has further increased due to escalation in rates. As the hostel is incomplete and the condition may deterioate further if the building is not completed. The completion of this hostel is necessary to accommodate the additional students likely to come in the new session starting in the month of August 2002. Therefore, a provision of Rs. 80.00 lacs has been made in this budget for completion of the balance work.

Staff Quarters including Warden Houses

The construction of staff quarters started in the year 1998-99 and a provision of Rs. 250.00 lacs was made. However, due to scarcity of funds, the works on even most essential quarters could not be completed till date. To complete these quarters a provision of Rs. 169.00 lacs was made during the year 2000-2001 which was further postponed to 2001-2002. Since the funds were not released during the year 2001-2002, the whole project is again postponed to the year 2002-2003 and for completion of these houses, a total amount of Rs. 170.00 lacs is required. However, to meet the most essential requirement of quarters, a provision of Rs. 60-90 lacs has been made in this budget.

Works to be started

The following building works are yet to be started as per the Detailed Project Report:

Administrative Block 3739 m²

The works on Administrative Block could not be started due to non-vacation of land and non-availability of funds. Since the stay on land has been vacated and the farmers have agreed to give 32 acres of land. A provision of Rs. 170.00 lacs has been made in this budget for the construction of this building.

Guest House, Staff Club, Students Activitiy Centre and Canteen

The work on these buildings could not be started earlier due to non-availability of funds. Since the project has already been delayed considerably, a provision of Rs. 110.00 lacs has been made in this budget for completion of these buildings.

Campus Development

A provision of Rs. 40.00 lacs has been made in this budget to provide the development works such as sewerage, drainage, water supply, earth filling, roads, electricity and boundary walls etc. in the 32 acres of land likely to be acquired.

MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT

Keeping in view the most essential requirement of the laboratories in the year 2002-2003 and the laboratories which could not be equipped due to scarcity of funds in the year 2001-2002. A provision of Rs. 70.00 lacs has been made in this budget. The details are as given below:

OTHER FACILITIES

Furniture & Fixture

To equip the lecture halls, tutorial rooms, laboratories, library, hostels, offices, students amenities and sports facilities, a provision of Rs. 10.00 lacs has been made in this budget. The amount as projected will be needed to complete the required furniture and fixture as per plan.

Library

A provision of Rs. 5.00 lacs has been made in the regular budget for purchase of text books, hand books, reference books, for meeting the requirement of AICTE, New Delhi for running the six courses. Main purchase will be Encyclopedia Britannica, edition and the reference index manual apart from other reference books.

Office Equipment (including EPABX system)

For setting up of EPABX system in the college and purchase of aditional type writers, photocopier-cum-printers, water coolers, display boards, etc. a sum of Rs. 17.00 lacs has been made in this budget.

Other Amenities

For meeting the requirement of medical equipment, sports equipment, hostel equipment, a provision of Rs. 2.00 lacs has been made in this budget.

RECURRING

A sum of Rs. 416.25 lacs has been perovided in this budget to meet the recurring expenditure during the year 2002-2003 as per the details given below:

Paro& Allowances

A provision of Rs. 325.00 lacs has been made in this budget for the year 2002-2003 which includes the arrears of Rs. 100.00 lacs to be paid to the teaching staff on account of the revision of pay scale by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi. The requirement of additional staff and placement of staff in higher scales has also been taken care of. The details are placed at ANNEXURE – III (at page from 29 to 30).

TA & LTC

A provision of Rs. 4.00 lacs has been made in this budget for meeting the expenses for TA & LTC.

Medical Reimbursement

A nominal amount of Rs. 1.00 lacs has been proposed to meet the medical expenses for indoor treatment of the employee and their families.

Corgingencies

Due to increase in the wages of casual employees, electricity charges, maintenance of computers and other miscellaneous expenses, a provision of Rs. 86.25 lacs been made in this budget under different heads.

Item No. 10.4 To consider and approve the rate of interest to be paid to the employees on C.P.F. during 2001-2002.

The employees of Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur are to be paid interest @ 9.5 % on CPF during the financial year 2001-2002. The college has received Rs. 912538.00 as interest on the CPF amount deposited in the State Bank of India, Gurdaspur. The rate of interest varies from 8.5 % to 10.5 % (compounded quarterly) during the financial year 2001-2002 on the fixed deposits on CPF accumulation made in the bank. Since it is the statutory requirement to pay 9.5 % interest for the year 2001-2002, it is proposed that the difference in the interest to be paid and earned, if any, may be allowed to be paid by the College.

Further, the Government of India has lowered the rate of interest on GP fund from 9.5 % to 9 % w.e.f. 1.4.2002 and therefore, interest at the revised rate, if any, allowed to be paid for the year 2002-2003 as and when announced by the Punjab Government.
